Arid Aruba — Small and Friendly

Just 15 miles north of the Venezuelan coast, the long, skinny island of Aruba is dry and sunny year-round. On the low hills, a variety of cacti play extravagant contrast to island houses painted in soft pastels, and rising demurely from colorful flower gardens behind cactus fences.

Sculpted by tradewinds, the local divi-divi trees lean to the winds, their top branches undulating in the breeze like hair underwater. Below the jagged cliffs, thundering waves beat against a coral rock shore, sending magnificent plumes of ocean spray skyward. This is Aruba, where the turbulent Atlantic has eroded the coral cliffs, carving out the Caribbean's highest, most dramatic and spectacular natural bridge.

The constant oceanic rage is so violent, so unsettling in its effect and so eerie in its mood, that one forgets this is sleepy little Aruba, whose op-

posite shoreline sports acres of picture postcard-perfect white sand beaches and miles of waves gently lapping ashore.

Smallest and most westerly of the ABC group of the Netherlands Antilles (with the islands of Bonaire and Curaçao), Aruba is just 19 miles long and only six miles wide – an area totaling just less than 70 square miles. South of the capital city of Oranjestad, the desert-like island rises to its highest point at Mount Yamanota, a 617-foot cone-shaped hill. Down the coast a few miles is the island's second city, St. Nicholaas, which came to life when a subsidiary of Exxon built an oil refinery — then the largest in the world — here in 1929. Oil was always the dominant source of Aruba's economy, and remained so until Exxon closed the refinery in 1985, a shock of such enormous proportions that the local economy is still recovering. Tourism has been the most significant factor in that recovery; since the mid-1970s, modern hotels and casinos have risen to meet the demand of steadily increasing numbers of visitors who have discovered that

Aruba has some of the finest beaches in the West Indies.

Little Venice

Alonso de Ojeda claimed Aruba for Spain when he navigated the coastal region of the South American continent in 1499. Until then, the island had been inhabited by the peaceful Arawak Indians who were occasionally attacked by the warlike and cannibalistic Carib tribes. Archaeological discoveries of artifacts over 2,000 years old attest to the advanced society of the Arawaks.

Amerigo Vespucci, the Florentine explorer who ultimately lent his name to the large continents to the north and south, also visited the island; the coastal villages on stilts so reminded him of Venice, that he christened the island "Venezuela" or "Little Venice." Vespucci's appellation later got reapplied to the larger land across the 15-mile strait.

Carib words are said to have given the island its eventual name. *Ora* means "shell," and *oubao* is "island" in the Indian language; Aruba may have derived from the two words. Other schools consider the name comes from the Spanish *ora uba*, meaning "gold was found here." But it is likely that the name pre-dates the discovery of gold in 1824; it was mined successfully for 90 years, but mineable quantities ran out in 1913, and only occasionally today is a nugget found which fans further fever of former gold rush days.

Tile Roofs and Tall Hotels

Although Aruba's 70,000+ people can trace their roots to more than 40 nationalities, more than half proudly count Arawak Indian among their ancestry. These gentle, smiling people were slender and

A Letter from the Captain Regarding Typhoon Haiyan in the Philippines

Dear Guests,

I know many of you are all too well aware of Typhoon Haiyan's devastating destruction in the Philippines. Over the last few days we have been trying to assist in getting all affected crew in touch with their families but this continues to be extremely difficult with the destruction to telephone lines and infrastructure etc. Some of our fellow crew are still struggling to make contact and I know you will join me in really hoping and praying for good news soon. NYK-Fil, our affiliated manning and recruiting agency in the Philippines, is assisting crew to locate family members. In addition, they are trying to locate and communicate with crew who are on vacation.

I also note that many guests and crew have been asking how they can help out financially for those who have been affected. There are many relief organizations with websites explaining what they are doing at the moment to assist, but I also know that many of you have asked how you may be able to help our crew more directly.

To assist, a foundation has been set up through NYK-Fil for donations received which will be matched by Crystal Cruises. While there are a number of relief organizations already helping, we are encouraging Guests and Crew to donate to **NYK-TDG Friendship Foundation, Inc.**, a foundation established to collect and disburse funds received directly to the crew and families affected. In the event that we learn that no Crystal crew members were directly affected, the monies collected will be used to support local NYK staff and their affected families.

Details of how Guests may also contribute to the foundation are available at the Reception Desk.

Of course, you may feel free to send your donation to any other relief organizations you prefer, and I know they would all appreciate your support.

Thank you again for your support to all our fellow crew affected and I know they will appreciate any assistance you are able to provide. Our hopes, thoughts and prayers are with them during this most difficult time.

handsome; Arubans have retained these traits. More than 75% of the population is island-born, and the rest are from Holland, Britain, North America and Venezuela (from which much of Aruba's tourist trade also originates).

Tourism flourishes, not strictly because of the sleek resorts, hotels, casinos, extraordinary beaches and brilliant, warm sea, but because Arubans go out of their way to make their island an especially pleasant place to be, and they warmly bridge the gap between their red-tile-roof cottages and the tall hotels. They like meeting people, and they want visitors not only to see their island, but to learn and understand it, which is why taxi touring here is worthwhile, if you haven't availed yourself of our shore excursions.

In the course of a half day's drive, you can learn a little of the local language, Papiamentu (*bon dia* for good morning, *masha danki*, thank you), hear about Aruban courtship (before a young man can call on a girl seriously, he must build himself a house), find out who Lloyd C. Smith was (the waterfront drive is named after him), witness the fascinating juxtapositions of cacti and Dutch windmills, idyllic beaches and treacherous surf-pounded cliffs, and make at least one Aruban friend: your driver. You will also learn that Aruban smiles are real: simply and genuinely they mean *bon bini* – welcome.

Oranjestad at a Glance

The 18th century Fort Zoutman on the edge of town is worth a visit, as is Willem III Tower, the lighthouse first lit in 1867.

A stroll along Lloyd C. Smith Boulevard brings you to Wilhelmina

Park, a brilliant showcase of tropical gardening on the waterfront. Any number of good restaurants in the area will provide an excellent lunch. Or buy some Dutch cheese and fresh fruit, and head north out of town to the charming picnic grove at Manchebo, or another half mile farther to Eagle Beach or Palm Beach where there are palm-thatched picnic cottages among the major hotels and resorts of the island.

Crystal Symphony is scheduled to dock at Pier "C" in the Oranjestad Cruise Passenger Terminal in Oranjestad, Aruba, at 8:00am today, Wednesday, November 13, 2013.

An announcement is made as soon as the ship is cleared by local authorities. We ask you not to crowd the gangway, but make yourself comfortable until the ship has been cleared and you are free to proceed ashore.

When going ashore, please remember to carry your **Guest Identification Key Card**, as you must show it to the Security Officer when leaving and reboarding Crystal Symphony.

The pier is a 10-minute walk (600 meters) from the Oranjestad town center. Due to local restrictions, no shuttle service is available in this port of call. Taxis are available outside the port gate; prices are usually fixed rates per person to various destinations.

The local currency of Aruba is the *Aruban Guilder*. The current rate of exchange is approximately US \$1.00 = AWG 1.77. US dollars are widely accepted around the island.

Crystal Symphony is scheduled to sail for Miami, Florida, USA, at 5:00pm. Please be back on board by 4:30pm.

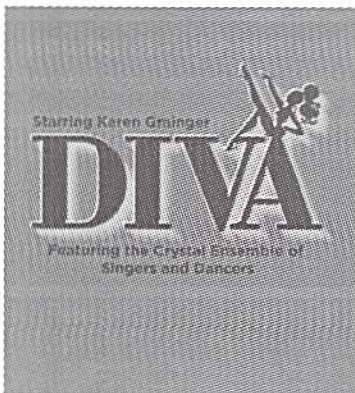

Today's Cocktail Suggestion

Sex on the Beach

The earliest known invention of the cocktail and its name dates back to 1987 in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida to promote a then new product, Peach Schnapps. A young bartender inspired by Spring Break is credited with its inception.
